San Juan Islands' Firefighter Association Hosts Special Edition of the Annual Easter Egg Hunt

The San Juan Islands' Firefighter Association will host our second, special edition of the annual Easter Egg Hunt, this Sunday, April 4 from Noon until 2:00 p.m.

Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the association is offering a Friday Harbor Family Walking Tour. We hope you will join us for a fun walk around town, visit with some of our firefighters and keep an eye out for the Easter Bunny!

Wearing COVID-19 masks, families will follow a route around the town, looking to spot firefighters positioned outside, in front of certain businesses. They will stamp your passport and you can visit the Easter Bunny in the Wells Fargo bank parking lot on Spring Street.

The annual family Easter Egg Hunt has been hosted by the Firefighter Association for more than 25 years and the event has historically been held at Jackson Beach. Instead of cancelling this tradition due to the COVID-19 health pandemic, the association created it's second, special edition Easter Egg event for a safe, fun, outing for our Islands' families.
