
6-Month Volume



## **Operations Activities:**

Minimum Staffing for July was met.

New wildland firefighter member added to the roster.

Wildland fire Pleasant Valley Rd/Structure fire Larson St

School District alarm system problems – Superintended notified

Leased vessel acquired as stop gap for marine operations, operations implementation plan is in process, launch date this week (with restrictions). Capabilities are limited however response times will be much improved.

Vessel assigned back to the Port of Friday Harbor. Researched launching from Roche Harbor. Trailering is complex and time consuming. Response times to staff Roche Harbor are significant.

EMS response personnel interaction between San Juan Island EMS and San Juan Island Fire & Rescue is going well. The two-system response models lose certain operational efficiencies and cause unavoidable frustrations, however. A single system lead by data driven decisions is critical to improving overall EMS delivery to the community in addition to improving the work environment for staff and volunteers.

Volunteer staffing is light both from attrition and from the conflicting summer “hay” cycle. EMT recruitment schedule is posted, FF recruitment schedule is planned for winter.
